I re read my report as incoming President and found a couple of items which I didn't fulfill my intentions. The Club Treasurer Ian Berry has done a great job of looking after our finances and putting our records on MYOB. As director of Club Administration and President-Elect, Di Borella has brought us a varied and interesting line-up of guest speakers each week and we all went away from the meeting learning something new. Our Service Projects Director Martyn Wilkinson and his committee were very active with projects at the Cowdy Ward and Joan Ridley Garden which include painting and planting veggie gardens with many members getting involved on a Saturday morning. Martyn is also the Group One representative for Rotary Health Research. Foundation was enthusiastically directed by Ainslie Ward who among other projects organized a successful Harry Potter movie night on a very wet night with power failures at the cinema. Our Club membership experienced an increase in this year, although the Director Quentin Killian claims no credit for it. Quentin, Frank and Ian also made up our finance Committee who would meet each month and discuss all financial requests and make recommendations to the Board which saved a lot of time at Board Meetings as the requests had already been analyzed and prioritized.





I would also like to thank Shirley Alison for taking on the role as Sergeant for this year and doing it so well and to our volunteers who stepped in when Shirley was away working.

My first public appearance as President was at the Paramedic of the Year Award on the 9th August 2010 and I was very nervous. Hopefully I was a better speaker at the Aboriginal Health Worker Excellence Awards on the 19th November. Both these awards are a highlight of our Club year and recognize the dedication and excellence of these two vocations and we are very proud of our participation in and organization of these events. These events would not possible without the hard work of their organizing teams and I would like to acknowledge Malika Okeil, Wendy McKay, Sandy Oldroyd and other members who assisted.

It was a very active year for our Club and while we didn't have many social events, there were other opportunities for fellowship while barbecuing sausages at Bunnings and Harvey Norman, selling raffle tickets at Parap Markets, catering at the Supreme Court Open Day and selling tickets at the gate for the Garden Spectacular. A number of our members assisted other Rotary Clubs by volunteering to help on the bar for the Darwin North Rodeo and the Nightcliff Club on Australia Day for the Fun Run. This type of collaboration increases the good will between Darwin Rotary Clubs and gives us an opportunity to meet other Rotarians besides events such as District Assembly and District training... I also attended a two day conference in Canberra in September for Rotarians around Australia. The purpose of this conference was to discuss ways to increase membership, attract younger members and raise the profile of Rotary in the community.

A highlight of my year as President has been putting together a major fundraiser which has the potential to become an annual event. I had been formulating the idea for a fashion parade with a guest Fashion designer for quite a while and proposed the event to the Finance committee who gave me their support. I approached Sacha Drake a Brisbane Designer and she agreed to a date in March when she could be free to come to Darwin. Without the hard work and commitment of my committee – Purdey Eades, Ainslie Ward, Leanne Hardinge and Ian Berry this event would not have been as successful as it was. While numbers were low due to conflicting events, the publicity and PR generated was enormous.





With free television advertising from Southern Cross and subsequent publicity from the NT News and Resident Magazine our name is “out there”. Our models from our Club – Asha, Ainslie and Kiran McLaren together with Jess and Jade from the YMCA and Merissa Broadbent gave up their time for “model training” with Leanne Dowling on a Saturday afternoon and impressed Sacha Drake with their professionalism and enthusiasm and wore her garments with style and elegance.

I am very grateful to our MC Amy Davis and our auctioneer Darren Cole who donated their time to our event and adding to its success.

Now as my year draws to a close and I reflect on the past twelve months, I am happy to hand over to Di Borella but feel that I have contributed to the Club in a positive way and am unique in that this Club has never had a President in the Fashion Retail Industry. I would like to thank my family who has attended events to support me especially Jasmine and Michael who have helped at the Garden Spectacular and with the Fashion Parade. I am also very glad that in my year our first “Rotary baby” Grace was born to member Nicole Gale and her partner Gareth Jakeman. We can claim to be the only Rotary Club in Darwin with a baby.

I wish Di and her Board a great year and I will continue to support the Club in my role as Immediate Past President.

Treasurer's Report

My major goals for this year have been to complete codifying a budget process and to get the Club back into the audit cycle that has fallen away over the last few years.

The budget process project has had a rocky year and still remains incomplete, although significant work has been done on it.

An audit of the Club's last financial year (2009/10) is currently in progress.

The major change in arrangements this year has been the inauguration of the Finance Committee to look at, assess and recommend expenditure to the Board, and to assess and advise the Board on proposed fund raising activities.

Current Assets (as at 31-May-11) are approx \$12,000 in the current account and \$12,000 in the investment account. We are slightly above the same time last year. Our turnover for this financial year to date is just over \$48,000, (down \$5,000 on same time last year), of which we have fund raised \$20,000 and donated just over \$16,000. Broad details of income & expenditure are below, with detailed balance and Profit & Loss statements attached to this report. It should also be noted that the Board approved the write off of just over \$3,000 in bad debts during this year, and has yet to decide the Club's annual contribution to the Rotary Foundation and Australian Rotary Health.

I believe that the Club's finances are on a sound footing going forward to a new financial year.

I would like to acknowledge the support that I have received throughout from the Board, and those unsung heroes who collect and raise money at our meetings

The Profit & Loss and Balance Sheet are reported separately in this report on pages 41-42).

2010 Aboriginal Health Worker Awards

On 19 November 2009, The Honourable Kon Vatskalis MLA once again hosted the Aboriginal Health Workers Excellence Awards at Parliament House. This event is a major annual event for the Aboriginal Health Worker profession in the NT.

The Aboriginal Health Worker Excellence Awards were initiated by the Rotary Club of Darwin Sunrise in 2006 to acknowledge the dedication and service they provide within the health care system through-out the Northern Territory.

These Awards are held in recognition of the work that this group of health professionals deliver to ensure that Aboriginal Territorians are able to access quality health care.

The Rotary Club of Darwin Sunrise was again the major sponsor and organiser of this event in 2010, supported and sponsored by the Department of Health and Families, Department of Health and Ageing, and the Liquor Hospitality Miscellaneous Union. This event was also fully supported by the Aboriginal Medical Services Alliance NT.



This year's 'Legend' award was presented to Nathan Aucote who began his career 16 years ago at Mutitjulu where he ran a Men's Health program. After doing this for seven years, Nathan was able to set up Men's Health Programs so that others were able to implement in other communities.

Nathan has worked for the Central Australian Remote Health Development Services providing education and training programs to Aboriginal Health Worker, before joining the Department of Health and Families as the Aboriginal Health Worker Director for Central Australia Remote Health.

In 2009 he completed his postgraduate studies in professional management, receiving an academic award for his achievement.

Nathan currently manages a team of dedicated senior Aboriginal Health Workers provides support and development to community based Aboriginal Health Workers in Central Australia. He has promoted and supported Aboriginal Health Workers into management roles and currently one of these participants is acting Area Services Manager in Central Australia. In recent times Nathan has been the Acting General Manager for the Central Australia Remote Health.

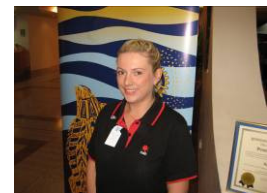

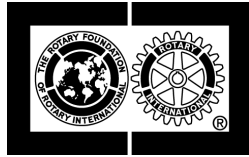

In 2010/11 the Rotary Foundation committee aimed to raise funds for the Rotary Foundation by:

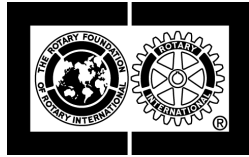
Continuing with the Polio Containers and improving the polio containers

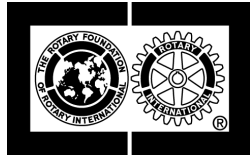

Vocational Training Team (VTT)

As part of The Rotary Foundation's Future Vision Plan the unique cultural and vocational exchange program known as Group Study Exchange (GSE) has been superseded by Vocational Team Training (VTT).

The new global grants offered under the Future Vision Plan can support vocational training teams. Clubs and districts are encouraged to pinpoint their community's needs and strengths within an identified area of focus when developing vocational trainings with other clubs or districts

Vocational training teams are groups of professionals traveling abroad to either learn more about their profession or teach local professionals about a particular field. They

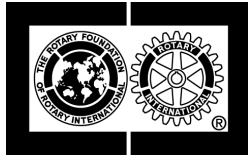
- May build the capacity of either the team itself or a specific benefiting community
- May be carried out in conjunction with a humanitarian project or scholarship
- May be multivocational but must share a common purpose in support of the selected area of focus

One significant change in the transition from Group Study Exchange to VTT is the vocational training opportunities it provides for Rotarians as well as non Rotarians. Rotarians can apply not only for team leader but also as team members. The team

- Must consist of a minimum of one Rotarian team leader and three non-Rotarian team members with no maximum limit of participants
- Have no restrictions on participant age or length of time for training
- Permit one or more teams to travel under each grant

Rotary Foundation's new grant model will be tested by 100 pilot districts beginning 1 July 2010. The plan will roll out for all districts in 2013.





INBOUND

This year Darwin briefly hosted a team of 7 from Chicago in D6400 who were travelling to Dili to work on projects in Midwifery areas and were mainly Pharmacists and medical qualified persons. The team will train Midwives, and pharmacy managers. The seven person team (Team Leader, 3 Midwives, 2 Pharmacists and a Videographer) was in East Timor from 5th to 28th May. They worked from the base clinics of the Cooperativa Café Timor in the highland areas of East Timor at Maubisse (Ainaro District) and Letefoho (Ermera District).



Whilst they were in Darwin they met with the midwifery group practice, the midwifery and the pharmacy units at Royal Darwin Hospital. Darwin Sunrise members were again stalwarts of the program. James, Wendy and Di organized the vocational interaction and team members were hosted by Wendy and Dan, Di and Jeff, Marilyn and Leanne and Warren and Diana.

OUTBOUND

This team was made up of workplace trainers along with school teachers and school principals. It is a very good team with many, many years of expertise in the area of literacy. The team leader John Clark was the Principal of the School of the Air at Charters Towers.
